Sheriff Ron Hain

The County Sheriff is the chief principal law enforcement officer of the County and the only full-time elected County law enforcement official provided for by the Illinois Constitution.

The Sheriff is responsible for numerous and diverse services. In addition to providing direct law enforcement and public safety service to all citizens in unincorporated Kane County, a Sheriff and their Sheriff's Deputies also supplement and assist other law enforcement agencies in the County as needed. The Sheriff's Office works closely with and provides assistance to the social service agencies in the County. Along with general law enforcement, criminal investigations, and public safety services, the Kane County Sheriff also provides other services including, but not limited to, Multi-Jurisdictional SWAT, School Resource Officers for the Kaneland and Central School Districts, Too Good For Drugs instructor, bomb detection canine units, narcotic detection and criminal apprehension canine units, Office of Emergency Management, and Bomb and Hazardous Materials Response Unit.

The Sheriff also maintains dockets, registers, jail records, fingerprints, and arrest files. Writs and warrants are executed, and summons and subpoenas are served. The Sheriff's deputies also attend all courts on record, and accept and receipt bail in accordance with the rules of the Circuit Court.

In other statutory duties, the Sheriff maintains the Kane County Jail, which is located within the Public Safety Building and has a total capacity of 640 detainees. These

individuals are serving court sentences or awaiting trial in lieu of bail.

Finally, the Kane County Sheriff's Court Security Division provides security for the six courthouses Kane County. These officers have arrest power solely connected to their function in the courthouse.

BIOGRAPHY

Ron has served in law enforcement for over 29 years and has been credited with hundreds of major criminal arrests. He has worked in varying capacities, including narcotics officer, canine handler, and SWAT Team leader, and he developed, implemented, and supervised the Sheriff's Office Criminal Interdiction Team. Ron is a nationally recognized expert in interstate criminal and terrorist interdiction. Sheriff Hain has received five meritorious service awards and two Deputy of the Year awards for several successful major criminal investigations. He was also twice nominated for the Kane County Officer of the Year Award. Additionally, Ron received the nationally-presented "Relentless Award" in 2013 for his work in criminal interdiction. In his career, Ron Hain has seized over 4,000 lbs. of dangerous drugs and over \$3,000,000 in illicit currency, along with hundreds of illegally possessed firearms associated with those crimes.

Ron was first elected as Kane County Sheriff in November of 2018, and his team immediately implemented employment diversion programs in the jail, along with medically assisted treatment to support and redirect inmates with drug addiction issues. With re-election to office in 2022, Sheriff Hain continues his focus on a zero-tolerance approach to street crime while providing positive life paths for incarcerated Kane County residents in an effort to drive down recidivism and crime rates.

Undersheriff Amy Johnson has served in law enforcement for over 19 years and has been credited with many awards and accolades. Throughout her career, she has worked in varying capacities, including Officer in Charge (OIC), Recruitment Officer, Investigator/Detective, Crime Scene Evidence Technician, Grant Writer, Field Training Officer, Juvenile Officer, as well as many other specialty areas not named. She was also a member of the Kane County Accident Reconstruction Team and continued to assist as an active member of the Kane County Major Crimes Task Force for Crime Scene Investigations. She has been nationally recognized for her expertise in not only forensic evidence but also in the investigation of many major noteworthy crime scenes. She has received one Meritorious Service award and provided teaching assistance to many in law enforcement seeking out a career in forensic science/crime scene investigations. During her career, she has been assigned over 1,000 cases involving both investigations and crime scene assistance throughout Kane County.

Undersheriff Johnson was promoted to Chief of Staff in May 2022, where she remained until December 2022 when she was promoted to Undersheriff. She holds a Bachelor of Science Degree from Illinois State University and a Master's Degree in Criminal Justice and Policing. She is also currently writing her dissertation for her PhD in Public Policy and Administration from Walden University.

Chief of Staff Edward Catich

Chief Edward Catich is the Chief of Staff for the Kane Sheriff's Office. Catich joined the Kane County Sheriff's Office as an Auxiliary Deputy in 2002. He previously served in the US Army as a Combat Engineer and then later as an IBEW Union Electrician. Catich transitioned from the construction trades and formally joined the Kane County Sheriff's Office as a full-time Deputy in 2005.

During his law enforcement career, Chief Catich has worked in the Sheriff's Office Patrol Division, Investigations Division, and as the primary Support Services Deputy. Catich has spent the last 11 years as a logistics/armored vehicle specialist for the Special Weapons and Tactics Team. He also spent six years as an operational member of a state-wide Illinois Law Enforcement Alarm System Mobile Field Force (ILEAS Region 3 North).

For the past 11 years, Chief Catich has been the lead requisition coordinator for the Kane County Sheriff's Office as a participant in the Law Enforcement Support Office (LESO) Program for the Department of Defense. He was promoted to Chief of Staff in December 2022.

Administrations Commander Brandon McKiness

Commander Brandon McKiness has served with the Kane County Sheriff's office for over 17 years. He is currently the Administrative and Office of Professional Standards Commander.

He started his career in 2005 in the Kane County Jail as a Corrections Officer and then transferred to Public Safety as a Patrol Deputy in 2006. In 2012 Commander McKiness became a detective and remained in that role until 2020

when he was promoted to Sergeant. Shortly after being promoted, Commander McKiness started our Special Victims Team within the Investigations Division where he was a staunch advocate for domestic violence victims and worked tirelessly with community members and organizations to combat domestic violence. He served in that unit until being moved into his current role.

Commander McKiness is currently the Commander of the Kane County Major Crimes Task Force and is the Team Leader for the Negotiations Response Team within Kane County S.W.A.T. Team. Commander McKiness is also a Board Member with the Illinois Crises Negotiations Association and a former board member with the Community Crises Center.

Commander McKiness has received several awards and commendations including the Medal of Valor and Life Saving award.

Public Safety Commander David Wolf

Commander David Wolf has served with the Kane County Sheriff's for 26 years and is currently the Commander of Public Safety. He started in the Patrol Division in 1997, and in 1999 he was selected to join the Kane County Sheriff's SWAT Team.

In 2002, he was made a Detective and assigned to the Investigations Division. Throughout his career, he has served in investigations as Detective, Sergeant, and Lieutenant.



In 2006, The Kane County Sheriff's SWAT team merged with St. Charles Police SRT. Upon the merger of the two teams, he was named one of the team leaders of the newly formed Kane County SWAT. He served as Team leader until he was named SWAT commander in 2014 and is still serving in that role.

In 2008, he joined the ILEAS Region IV WMD Team and served until 2015 when he was removed from the team due to other department commitments.

In 2020, he joined the Kane County Sheriff's Bomb Squad and later attended the FBI Hazardous Devices School. Commander Wolf is currently a certified bomb technician and received advanced certification as a Tactical Bomb Tech.

Commander Wolf is a graduate of Western Illinois University, where he received his bachelor's degree in Law Enforcement and Justice Administration. He has also completed Northwestern University School of Staff and Command.

Commander of Emergency Services Kevin Tindall

Commander Kevin Tindall has been with the Kane County Sheriff's Office for over 32 years, serving in several roles including patrol, field training officer, investigations, arson investigation, evidence, juvenile investigations, civil, training, and special services. In addition to regular duty assignments, he has served 17 years on SWAT, is the current Bomb Squad Commander, and is the Co-creator, previous commander, and founding member of the Kane County Fire Investigation Task Force, currently serving on its Executive Board. The Commander also established the Kane County Sheriff's Office EMS Division and serves as the EMS Coordinator as an EMS system provider under the Southern Fox Valley EMSS.

Commander Tindall holds degrees in Public Safety Management, Fire Service Management, and Emergency Medical Services. He is a graduate of the Northwestern University Center for Public Safety, School of Police Staff and Command, as well as being a recipient of the Kreml Leadership Award and is a graduate of the Hazardous Devices School at Redstone Arsenal, US Army, and FBI.

In his current role, Commander Tindall oversees the Emergency Services Division, including the Bomb Squad, Arson Investigation, Hazardous Materials, Respiratory Program Administrator, Emergency Medical Services (EMS) including overseeing the CPR/First Aid Program, Mobile Field Force (MFF), Special Services and remains a Task Force Officer (TFO) to the FBI for advanced Bomb Squad capabilities with a regional response team. Serves as the Chapter Director of the Northern Illinois Great Lakes Bomb Technician and Investigators as part of the International Association of Bomb Technicians and Investigators (IABTI).

Corrections Commander Perparim Osmani



Commander Osmani has served the Kane County Sheriff's Office since 2002. He is a certified Illinois Peace Officer and worked part-time for the Fox Valley Park District Police Department from 2005-2017.

He has served the Sheriff's Office in the following capacities: Field Training Officer, Corrections Response Team, Corrections Gang Investigation Unit, and Corrections Investigation Unit. After his promotion to Sergeant in 2011, he served as Sergeant of Housing Units and later as Sergeant of Intake and Release. Osmani was promoted to Lieutenant in 2019, where he oversaw operations in the Classification Division and Intake and Release Division. In 2021, he was promoted to Commander.

Commander Osmani was the recipient of the Sheriff's Office Corrections Officer of the Year Award in 2007 and Leadership Awards in 2011 and 2013, as well as Meritorious Awards in 2007, 2013, 2015, and 2019.

Court Security Commander Lloyd Fletcher

Commander Fletcher has a law enforcement career spanning over 30 years with the Bartlett Police Department and the Kane County Sheriff's Office. In 1992, he began working as a Police Officer for The Bartlett Police Department. During his service with Bartlett, he served as a Patrol Officer, a Field Training Officer, a Public Relations Officer, Juvenile Officer, Training Records Officer, and as a leader on the Gang Task Force Team. Fletcher also implemented the first gym at the Department, where he trained his fellow Officers and promoted fitness for duty programs.

After his career with the Bartlett Police Department, Commander Fletcher began working for Kane County. In 2007, Commander Fletcher was appointed to the Kane County Sheriff's Court Security Division where he has served in a variety of positions including Member of the Rapid Deployment Team, Sergeant of Court Security, Director of Court Security, Lieutenant of Court Security, and, in 2020, was promoted to Commander of Court Security.

In his role as the Commander of Court Security, Fletcher is primarily charged with providing a safe and orderly environment for the people and court facilities of the 16th Judicial Circuit in Kane County with the following responsibilities:

- Prepare Budget
- Oversee Training and Mandated Training
- Policies and Procedures
- Union Negotiations

During the previous reporting period of October 1, 2021 – September 30, 2022, the Homeland Security Investigations (HIS) Chicago Financial Crimes Investigations Group (FIG) was able to execute 40 search, arrest, and seizure incident reports involving 17 arrests and the seizure of \$2,697,452 in narcotics proceeds, \$300,000 in trafficker funds repurposed as CUC proceeds, 32 kilograms of fentanyl, 189 kilograms of cocaine, six kilograms of methamphetamine, two kilograms of heroin, four assault weapons/handguns, six vehicles, and one airplane within the HSI Chicago area of responsibility. In addition, the HSI Chicago FIG sent investigative leads to eight domestic and international HSI offices resulting in the seizure of an additional \$1,452,680 in narcotics proceeds and two seizures of 100 kilograms and 1,340 kilograms of cocaine; thereby bringing an aggregate seizure of \$4,450,132 in bulk cash narcotics proceeds and 1,669 kilograms of narcotics valued in excess of \$45,000,000.

CARPENTERSVILLE MAN FACES CHILD PORNOGRAPHY CHARGES

Kane County State's Attorney Jamie L. Mosser and Sheriff Ron Hain announce that **Christopher M. Scholl** is charged with the offenses of:

- Disseminating child pornography/moving depictions Class X felony, 10 counts
- Possession of child pornography/moving depictions Class 2 felony, 10 counts

In 2022, Sheriff Ron Hain and State's Attorney Jamie Mosser were proud to announce the launch of their joint Child Exploitation Task Force focusing on cyber crimes involving the viewing, solicitation, and distribution of child pornography. Since the establishment of this group, they have arrested numerous child predators lurking in our community and brought them to justice.

*Statistically, over 90% of child pornography offenders have sexually assaulted a child at some point in their life.





*In 2022, a total of seven people came through the jail, then overdosed and died after release. Only the four recorded above were with us for more than seven days to receive treatment and support.
